Faculty-led Study Abroad Program

Earn college credit in HIST 3530 History of Science



Join us in England as we study the important ideas, people, institutions, and developments throughout archaeological time. Based in London, this study-abroad program includes day trips to Oxford, Cambridge, and surrounding areas. Students will visit artifact collections, hear world-renowned guest speakers, and see first-hand the objects and environments that are examined in the class.

Students are introduced to the history of science during the modern period — spanning from the 1450s to the present — with a focus on the history of archaeology in Britain. The course also analyzes the close relationship between science and culture, discussing issues such as ethnicity, socio-economic status, religion, and gender which pervade human society, and therefore science.

This is a junior- senior-level course and is a requirement for secondary education specialization. Credit may count toward a history major, a minor in history or science and society, as well as a required elective for engineering disciplines. Prerequisites: You must have taken one of the following courses — HIST 1100/1200/1300/1310
